

# Generating Community “A Social Church”

## Ecclesiastes 4:9-11; John 5:1-9; Matthew 22:36-40

### Reflect

God said it was not good that man was alone when he created Adam. God saw a need that humans need human friendship/companionship. A relationship with God only is not complete until the human relationship factor is solved. This lesson was about us being a part of a home group or a women’s group, or a prayer group or a men’s group, where intentional relationships can be formed. For those of you who are reading this, you are in a home group, fellowshiping with others. But let’s evaluate how a home group has been a benefit to you, and your relationship with God and with others in a Christ centered environment.

### Discussion Questions

1. What are the top 3 areas in a church that attract you? What is it that you are looking for in a church that will keep you around in that church? Mention them and talk about why those 3 are important to you.
2. It was talked about how we can have a relationship with God but nothing intentional with others in a Christ centered environment. What we discovered in the teaching. That it doesn’t help your relationship with God if we are not intentional with others. Explain how being in a home group and being in Christ centered environment has made your relationship with God healthier, now that you are connected to others... Or, how your relationship with your spouse (or others) has become healthier because of you being connected to God.
3. Our homegroups are like the Acts 2 home groups. We have the Sunday teaching we talk about, we have snacks the breaking of bread fellowshiping around snacks or food, and there is prayer at the end. What do you suggest could be added to your group, to help you jell more in reaching that point of loving one another? Suggestions; A mission project, an outreach, something fun outside of the home groups, a 5k?
